


DOMAINE MARSALEIX

- Our domaine is a wine estate located in the heart of the Luberon regional park, in the territory of the famouse village of Gordes.
- The Vineyard covers 11 hectares and all tje crops are organic.
- The wines of the Marsaleix estate are all in the Ventoux appellation, certified organic.




Presentation of the estate

A context, a rich soil...

- The Luberon/Ventoux valley, first known for its historical villages and its uniquely beautiful landscapes, also has the advantage of possessing a particularly advantageous soil for wine growing.
- Numerous studies have indeed revealed a soil with a very homogeneous clay-limestone association with an exceptional aeration, due essentially to the presence of sand.
- It is also thanks to his reputation that Joel Marsaleix fell in love with the region and decided to settle there.





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Joël Marsaleix, a passionate and committed winemaker.

- Joël Marsaleix, a great enthusiast of all things related to wine, embraced the career of winemaker as a second career. Aware of the richness of this terroir, he acquired land at the foot of the village of Gordes.
- As a fervent defender of nature, he decided to start cultivating his vines organically. A long work of compliance of the vines follows. At the same time, he pursues a training at the University of Wine of Suze-la-Rousse.
- This course of study sedimented his convictions, he wil produce quality organic wine in the pure tradition of making wine without artifice.

- At the Marsaleix estate, we work in a very particular way, considering that each element makes its contribution and constitutes a harmonious whole. This holistic method implies a subtle observation of the living, the material and the detail.
- In concrete terms, all these obbservations are based on empirical and scientific knowledge. The aim is, in fine, to guide the vinification of a wine by avoiding unnecessary interventions.
- To be more precise, we can say that we are in a process where the lunar cycles, the seasons and their particularities, the terroir, the weather and of course a multitude of diverse factors are all concrete tools that come into play in the winemaking process and that serve to guide the evolution of the wine



From the very first vintage, the wines seduce the professionals.

In the competitions where our wines are presented, certain wines such as the Rouge Tradition are immediately awarded medals: Gold and Silver. It has won four medals in two years.

The estate has won a total of seven medals since its creation. This has helped to launch the reputation of the Domaine and to gain the trust of select establishments. This is obviously a very promising encouragement.









THE CLASSIC RED



Composed of Syrah, Marselan, Carignan and Grenache, this is a red wine with an intense colour and brilliant purple highlights. The nose evokes crunchy red fruits (redcurrant, wild strawberry) with hints of spices that form a harmonious and greedy bouquet.

On the palate, it is a wine with subtle flavours of violet, cherry and strawberry. There are hints of smoky notes, all perfectly enveloped by silky and supple tannins. hey form a balanced and powerful whole.



Cuvée rouge tradition



Aged in oak barrels and composed of: 50% Syrah, 40% Marselan, 10% Carignan

It has an intense red colour with tiled highlights, and on the nose, there are expressions of ripe fruit and spices, which give it an intense and complex bouquet.

On the palate, the consistency with the nose is found in the ripe fruit and spices. All this is accompanied by the freshness of a minty bouquet. The tannins are present, they are silky, t








Made from a blend of Clairette and Roussanne, this wine has been aged for six months in barrel. Its colour is a clear and brilliant pale yellow.

The bouquet is expressive, evoking white fruits, flowers and verbena. On the palate, it is aromatic and delicate with floral and fruity notes, balanced with a fresh finish.






THE WHITE TRADITION

Aged in oak barrels for one year, this white wine has a clear and brilliant pale yellow colour. It is composed of Clairette and Roussanne. The nose is discreet but complex, with notes of fresh fruit, flowers and also spices such as vanilla.

In the mouth, the attack is supple, aromatic and complex. We find intensity, the taste of ripe fruits with floral and vanilla touches. The whole is well blended in a beautiful power and with a persistent finish.



THE ROSÉ

The rosé is composed of 60% Grenache, 30% Mourvèdre and 10% Syrah.

It has a pale pink colour with a silvery sheen, its colour is limpid and brilliant. Its nose is fresh and delicate, with subtle notes of citrus and peach.

On the palate, this rosé is perfectly balanced in accordance with the nose, we find flavours of citrus fruits and peaches to which are added touches of redcurrant.



The Phoenix as a symbol.

For Joël Marsaleix, the choice of the Phoenix as the estate's logo was obvious

- If for him, becoming a winegrower was the fulfilment of a dream, taking this path as a third career masked an approach that came from even deeper convictions. Those of a fervent defender of nature
- The first and most obvious one was to produce a quality organic wine without artifice. But more important than the wine itself was the way it was produced.
- And that way is to minimise the impact on nature and its ecosystems. And even to favour them by tending towards biodynamics, and by helping biodiversity to be maintained all around the land. The Phoenix as a symbol.



Finally, through the distribution and promotion of wine, there was also the desire to change people's consciousness. In all humility and by a subtle work of ant which consists in interacting with the customers that they are professionals and private individuals.

In the end, this is a bit of everything that the Phoenix expresses through this logo. Moreover, as if to support the symbolism of rebirth and the ever-renewed cycles, Joel Marsaleix has imagined it in the form of an Ouroboros. The snake that bites its own tail, an emblem of eternal renewal.

Marsaleix, médaillé du Ventoux

Chaque jour, nous vous suggérons un petit plaisir pour vos soirées sous couvre-feu. Aujourd'hui du vin, à déguster avec modération évidemment, puisque l'abus d'alcool est dangereux pour la santé.

Faute de Jeux olympiques, attardons-nous sur un autre type de distribution de médailles : celles qui distinguent les vignerons les plus méritants. L'appellation ventoux, le petit terroir d'exception du Luberon, à l'abri du mont Ventoux et des monts du Vaucluse, a trouvé son champion : Joël Marsaleix, qui rafle deux médailles d'or pour son rouge et son blanc. A Millésime Bio, en 2018, pour sa toute première cuvée, il avait déjà décroché l'argent. Dans quelques semaines, l'édition 2021 du grand rendez-vous des vins bio et ses dégustations à l'aveugle pourraient de nouveau distinguer le domaine Marsaleix.

Si l'on y croit, c'est que l'on aime ses vins et leur prix, à moins de 16 euros. L'ascension de ce Parisien qui voulait devenir vigneron est aussi savoureuse. Rien n'a été facile ces sept dernières années sur un vignoble d'à peine plus de 10 hectares qu'il a dû replanter à 40%, notamment de marselan, très présent dans les rouges.
